

Certificate of Non-use of Conflict Minerals

As required by the Conflict Minerals provisions under the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act of 2010, and the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission enacted rules as of August 2012, SECOMEA works proactively to ensure that our products do not contain any Conflict Minerals that directly or indirectly finance or benefit armed groups in the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC) or an adjoining country.

Based on a Guarantee of Non-use of Conflict Minerals and/or EICC Conflict Minerals Templates obtained from our material suppliers, SECOMEA hereby declares that, to the best of our knowledge, our products do not contain any of the following Conflict Minerals or their derivatives: Gold(⁷⁹Au), Tantalum(⁷³Ta), Tin(⁵⁰Sn), Tungsten(⁷⁴W).

This guarantee warrants that used Conflict minerals are "DRC Conflict-Free", i.e. they did not originate in the DRC Region, are from recycled or scrap sources, or have not directly or indirectly financed or benefited the armed groups in the DRC Region.

Conflict minerals that a supplier obtains from a smelter or refiner listed on the CFSP compliant smelter list are considered DRC Conflict Free by SECOMEA. The list of compliant smelters and refiners is posted at <http://www.responsiblemineralsinitiative.org/smelters-refiners-lists/>

SECOMEA works proactively with our suppliers to adopt conflict mineral policies and systems that are designed to prevent conflict minerals that are not DRC Conflict Free from being included in the materials sold to SECOMEA, and to require their suppliers to adopt similar policies and systems.
